

School Uniform Policy

Mission, Vision and Culture

At Hillcross we enable our children to think differently, aim high and achieve.

Through our school culture of high aspiration, embracing challenge, collaboration, shared responsibility and respect for each other, we aim for Hillcross to be the number one school of choice for the local community. Our outstanding practice in all we do alongside our dynamic and ambitious curriculum provides all our children with rich opportunities and experiences for high quality learning and wider personal development.

Introduction

At Hillcross we have an agreed school uniform in order to enhance school pride, unity and community spirit—wearing a school uniform also reduces the chance of children making judgements about each other based on appearance. As a member of Hillcross Primary School all children are expected to observe this policy.

All items of school uniform - this includes shoes, lunchboxes and water bottles — should be labelled. Parents are asked to regularly check the uniform their child brings home - it is very easy for items of uniform to get mixed up. If this has happened parents are asked to bring back anything they find that is not their child's and the school will reunite it with its owner.

Winter Uniform

- Maroon long sleeved cardigan or V-neck sweatshirt with school logo*
- White or maroon short sleeved polo shirt (with or without logo*) or white shirt/blouse
- Grey pinafore dress, skirt, skort or tailored trousers.
- White, grey or black socks *or* black or grey tights (no under leggings)
- Black shoes (not sling-back, open toed or heeled). No boots, canvas pumps or trainers.

Summer Uniform – when the weather is warm, the children may choose to wear the following items:

- Grey school shorts
- Pink/white or red/white checked summer dress (no all in one or 'hybrid' versions).
- White/black closed toe leather sandals

PE Kit

- White school PE t-shirt with school logo*
- Black PE shorts or thick black cycling shorts
- Plain black jogging bottoms/tracksuit bottoms or thick sports leggings only
- Maroon round neck sports sweat shirt with school logo*
- Indoor gym shoes (preferably black plimsolls) and trainers (for outdoor PE)
- PE Kit should all be stored in a named Hillcross drawstring bag*

The PE kit listed is considered to be part of our school uniform and children should have this in school every day. Trainers for PE can be any colour so that they can be used outside of school too, but please



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remember how often these get lost and that they will be worn in muddy conditions, so do not send your child to school with expensive trainers.

Other school uniform Items

- All children in EYFS and KS1 should have a Hillcross School Book Bag* or small Hillcross School Rucksack*
- All children in KS2 should have a large Hillcross School Rucksack*
- All children should have a school water bottle with a coloured lid corresponding to their house colour.

*The school book bags and rucksacks are also part of our school uniform. They are designed to hold the necessary books, folders and equipment the children will need without any damage to them and their use minimises upset should they get lost or damaged.

Other items/requirements

- A warm coat should be worn to school on cold/cool days.
- Waterproof coats and wellies (with school shoes to change into) should be worn on wet days
- Sun hats or caps should be brought to school to be worn during outside play on sunny days*

Accessories

- Children may wear a small discrete wristwatch watches with additional functions and multimedia capability such as Fit Bits are not permitted.
- One small stud in each ear is allowed. (These must be removed and stored by the child for all PE sessions. Staff cannot accept responsibility for lost jewellery)
- Long shoulder length hair should be tied back with a plain, discrete hair tie (this applies to boys and girls).
- Hair styles should be smart, tidy and appropriate.
- Sunglasses and umbrellas are not permitted.
- Makeup, including nail varnish, should not be worn.

Equality Impact Assessment

The curriculum is planned to be inclusive and meet the needs and interests of a full range of learners. Activities and resources will be differentiated and adult support used to ensure that children access the curriculum and make the best possible progress.

Safeguarding Commitment

The school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children, in line with the most recent version of Keeping Children Safe in Education, and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. We take seriously our duty of care to our pupils and staff which includes safeguarding them from the risk of being drawn into terrorism - this includes not just violent extremism but also non-violent extremism, which can create an atmosphere conducive to terrorism and can popularise

Black trainers (no additional coloured marking) with Velcro fastening (no plimsolls). Maroon long sleeved cardigan or V-neck sweatshirt with school logo. **Optional Winter Uniform** Maroon long sleeved cardigan or V-neck sweatshirt with school logo. White or maroon short sleeved polo shirt (with or without logo) or white shirt/blouse. Grey pinafore dress, skirt, skort or tailored trousers. White, grey or black socks or tights (no leggings). Black shoes (not sling-back, open toed or heeled). No boots, canvas pumps or trainers. **Optional Summer Uniform** Grey school shorts. Pink/white or red/white checked summer dress (no all in one or 'hybrid' versions please). White/black closed toe leather sandals. **Compulsory Uniform Items** Maroon Hillcross Logo Book Bag (EYFS & KS1) or small Hillcross School Rucksack. **Optional Uniform Items** Reversible Fleeced Lined Jacket. Fully Zipped Fleece. PE Kit • PE sweatshirt with school logo. • PE t-shirt with school logo. • Black jogging bottoms or thick black sports leggings. • Black shorts or thick black cycling shorts. • Indoor plimsolls or trainers for indoor sports (These must not have been worn outside to protect the gym floor). • Outside trainers for outdoor sports (In the sports arena or field). • School logo drawstring PE bag to store kit. *Please note earrings must be removed or covered with plasters (please provide plasters). School water bottle with house team coloured lid (can be purchased from the school office).
