



YEAR 1 CURRICULUM INFORMATION

English

This term we will be: focussing on creating a diary entry to recount a Victorian child's everyday life. We will be using adverbs of time to order the events of the day, and ensuring it is written in the past tense correctly. We will also get the opportunity to write some historical fiction based on the classic story by Hans Christian Anderson, The Little Match Girl. Through adjectives and story language, we will create engaging and entertaining narratives to explore the life of a poor Victorian child.

Grammar: The year 1 skills we will be learning include using:

- capital letters, full stops and finger spaces consistently.
- question marks and exclamation marks when appropriate.
- using the conjunctions /and/ or /because/ to join two ideas
- ensuring that our cursive letters are correctly formed and clear to read.
- Using the suffix /ed/ to indicate that something has happened in the past.

Spelling: It is expected that Year One children should be able to read and spell all of the Unit 1-6 words uploaded recently to



Topic Overview

This half-term children will be exploring the fascinating Victorians. We will place the Victorian time period on a time line and learn why we call them the Victorians. We will learn how to use historical Some brilliant books to read sources to answer questions. We will learn what it was like to be a Victorian child, particularly a poor Victorian child. We will learn about the Factory Act of 1833 and why this was significant to the lives of . children at the time working in factories and mills.

- Estimate the position of numbers on number lines.
