



YEAR 4 CURRICULUM INFORMATION

<u>English</u>

This half term, the children will be writing a **persuasive letter**, an **information text** (non-chronological report about Ancient Egypt) and a **myth** relating to Horus (an Egyptian god).

<u>Grammar</u> - the grammar skills which we will be learning, include:

- varying writing to engage the reader, use a range of sentence types such as: statements, commands, exclamations, questions (including rhetorical), short simple sentences (for impact) and embellished simple sentences of 3 (for description);
- using subordinating conjunctions (for cause such as: because, if, although, even though) and coordinating conjunctions (so, and but, yet).
- Using adverbials to explain when and how things happen. These can come at the beginning, middle or end of sentences. E.g. <u>Quietly</u>, Horus crept towards the river bank <u>early that morning</u>.
- using **punctuation** to show how a sentence is constructed and how it should be read.

Topic Overview

During this topic, we will be using primary and secondary sources to investigate the Ancient Egyptians and use Howard Carter's diary entries to gather information about this historical era. This will help us to better understand: who the Egyptians were, how they lived, what their biggest achievements were, what they believed in and why are they still significant?

Our learning will help us to answer these questions:

- Who were the Ancient Egyptians? Why were they significant?
- What do the pyramids tell us about the achievements of the Ancient Egyptians?

 Explaining the value of digits in different ways. E.g. 4<u>7</u>32 - the digit 7 represents 700 or 70 tens (10s) or 7 x100. Using reasoning skills to order and compare the value of numbers. E.g.4001 > 4010 because... (focus on reasoning and explanation)
- Finding **1000 more or less** than a given number.
- Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000.
- Solve number and practical problems that involve all of the above.
- Addition and Subtraction: Using a range of strategies to complete addition and subtraction calculations.
- E.g. chunking, empty number line or column method.
- Mental Maths strategies

Adding 9, 99, 999 by compensating. E.g. 24 + 9 (24+10-1). 1000.

Recall x and \div facts for multiplication tables up to 12 × 12
