The Old Testament was written before Jesus was born and the New Testament is about Jesus.



4. What is the relevance of the Bible story 'Feeding the 5000' to our lives?

A Gospel story of Jesus feeding the 5,000. A young boy's lunch of loaves and fishes is blessed by Jesus and miraculously feeds a large crowd of people that have gathered.

2. What is the relevance of the Bible story <u>'Crossing the Red Sea' to our lives?</u>

Moses was leading the Israelites out of Egypt. But Pharaoh - the ruler of Egypt - had changed his mind about freeing the Israelites and they were being chased by his soldiers. Moses and the people were trapped with The Red Sea in front of them and the Egyptian soldiers following behind. Moses raised his stick over the water and a great wind blew which parted the sea. Moses led the Israelites safely to the other side, Moses brought the water back down. The Israelites were then safe from the soldiers.





3. What is the relevance of the Bible story <u>'Healing Two Blind Men' to our lives?</u>

Two blind men follow Jesus, calling out, "Have mercy on us" When he had gone indoors, the blind men come to him, and Jesus asks : "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" They reply, "Yes, Lord". He then touches their eyes, and says, "According to your faith let it be done to you"; and their sight is restored.
