YEAR 4 CURRICULUM INFORMATION



English

Using their knowledge they have built from their history lessons, the children will gather the information they need to write an information text on the Vikings. This will include using subheadings, formal language, fronted adverbial phrases and conjunctions.

Writing Skills:

Grammar - we will be embedding grammar within our lessons and will cover:

- Complex Sentences (using subordinate conjunctions) e.g. <u>Because</u> <u>he was ravenous</u>, the beast devoured the food.
- tumbling over the riverbed.
- Rhetorical Questions
- Sentence of 3 for Description
- Fronted adverbials (starting a sentence with information about: where, when, why or how something happens)

Spelling:

Maths

- Explore the 3, 6 and 9 times tables and the relationship between them and Solve Number and Practical Problems.
- Explore the 7 times table and the patterns within it.
- Explore square numbers.
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division.
- Learn how to multiply and divide by 10 and 100.

Mental Maths strategies:
