



# YEAR 2 CURRICULUM INFORMATION



### **English**

This half term, we will be writing a persuasive letter based on the

story 'Dear Greenpeace'.

### We will be focusing on the following skills:

- To understand different sentence typescommand, statement, exclamation, question
- To recognise the **features of a letter** (date, greeting, introduction, main body, conclusion and sign off)
- To understand persuasive techniques
- To use the conjunctions and, or, but, because, when, if
- To punctuate most sentences with capital letters and full stops.
- To reread over work to ensure it makes sense

### Spelling:

### We will be focusing on the following skills:

- To use contractions e.g. couldn't
- To use the suffixes ed, er, est and ing
- To recognise and use homophones for they're/their/ there and knew/new

<u>Guided Reading:</u> Our guided reading book for this half term is the 'Magic Finger' by Road Dahl. An amazing book that helps children to develop empathy and hold a debate.

### **Maths**

This half term, we will be focusing on multiplication and division.

- Counting in multiples of tens and fives can be represented by the ten and five times table.
- The relationship between the five and ten times table.
- Developing an understanding that same multiplication equations can have two different grouping interpretations (Commutativity)
- When two is a factor, we can use our knowledge of **doubling** to find the product.
- Halving is the inverse of doubling, we can use facts from the two times table to solve these problems.
- Products in the tens times tables are double the product in the five times table; products in the five times table are half the products in the ten times table.
- Division equations can be used to represent 'grouping' problems.
- Division equations can be used to represent 'sharing' problems.
- Developing more efficient strategies to solve problems, including multiplication facts and halving facts.
- Exploring when the **dividend is zero or one**.

# Our topic this half term is: Under the Sea

Topic Overview: During this topic we will be exploring the awes and wonders of under the sea! Within our science topic we will be looking at animal food chains. The children will be investigating looking at different food chains and understanding the impact on the ecosystem if the chain is broke. During our art lessons, we will be looking at the artist Henri Matisse. Children will learn the difference between a collage and a painting before creating their own final piece. The final art piece, will be an under the sea collage. We will be looking at the religion of Christianity and focussing on stories that are perceived as miracles.
