English

Year 6 Novel: The Boy in Striped Pyjamas

<u>Letters:</u> Children will be developing their skills of both formal and informal letter writing using inspiration from our class novel.

<u>Narrative</u>: We will be developing our ideas of a story by continuing chapters from The Boy in Striped Pyjamas. John Boyne's use of dialogue to advance the action, and his use of different sentence types within the story will be evaluated and then used by the children within their own writing.

<u>Grammar</u>: The Year 6 grammar skills we will be learning include:

- Modal verbs
- Passive voice
- Subjunctive form
- Accurate use of punctuation (inverted commas, semi colons, colons and apostrophes)
- Accurate use of punctuation for dialogue.

Please discuss these grammatical features with your children when they are reading and encourage them to check their writing for common mistakes.

Maths

Fact Fluency focus: Multiplication and division tables

<u>Fractions, decimals and percentages:</u> Children will be developing their understanding of equivalent fractions by finding highest common fractions to simplify and finding common denominators to add and subtract fractions.

Geometry: Children will be consolidating their understanding of shape, learning how to calculate the area and perimeter of 2D shapes. We will also be deepening our learning of coordinate grids, reflecting and translating shapes across four quadrants.

This half term, we will be delving deeper into the destruction of our planet and the effect humans are having on our world.
