



Key Vocabulary

Control : the ability to produce precise musical effects (with your voice)

Fluency : the ability of read and perform the music accurately

Accuracy: the ability of read and perform the music with complete control and fluency.

Chord: is any harmonic set of pitches consisting of different notes.

Chord progression : a succession of chord.

Dynamics: the *dynamics* of a piece is the variation in loudness between notes or phrases.

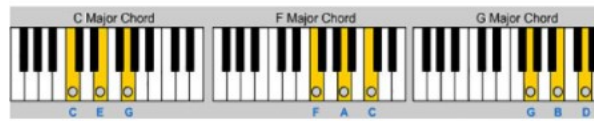
Phrasing: is the manner in which a **musician** shapes a sequence of notes in a passage of **music**, in order to express an emotion or impression.

What is a chord progression?

A **chord progression** is a sequence of musical **chords**, which are three or more notes, typically sounded simultaneously. : C-G-C-F then G-C-D-G..

What is a chord?

A **chord** is a group of notes which sound at the same time. **Chords** are usually made up of three basic notes, but any of the notes can be doubled up without changing the nature of the **chord**.
