



YEAR 2 CURRICULUM INFORMATION



English

This half term, we will be writing a narrative based on Paul Geraghty's 'The Hunter, a set of instructions and a travel brochure.

We will be focusing on the following skills:

- Adverbs of time to sequence
- Use the subordinating and coordinating conjunctions and, or, but, because, when, if
- Expanded noun phrases to describe
- To recognise the features of an information text
- Capital letters for proper nouns
- Using subject specific vocabulary

Spelling

We will be focusing on the following skills:

- To use contractions e.g. couldn't
- To use the suffixes ed, er, est and ing
- To recognise and use homophones for they're/their/ there and knew/new

<u>Guided Reading:</u> Our guided reading book for this half term is the 'The Hodgeheg' by Dick King Smith. Max is a hedgehog who lives with his family, but their house is on the wrong side of the road from the park where there is a beautiful lily pond and plenty of juicy slugs! Follow Max on his adventure as he dares attempt to cross the street!

Maths

During the Summer term, we will revisit time, recapping O'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to and then teaching:-

- 'to the nearest five minutes'
- Hours and days
- Find durations of time
- Compare durations of time

We also start to look at fractions - $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$ in relation to length, shape or a set of objects and then in the context of numbers.

We do ask that you continue to support your child at home and practice

- Adding and subtracting two two digit numbers.
- Using knowledge of number bonds to 10 and 20 to solve equations
- Using mathematical language to identify the properties of 2D and 3D shapes
- Using a variety of different coins to make the same amounts.
