## 5. How is the Bible used in public worship and for personal devotion?

The Bible can be seen as a guidebook where Christians can turn to for advice, guidance and reassurance. Passages from the Bible are read and discussed during regular worship services where the priest will read a certain passage of the Bible. This passage will often have some meaning. It also has a key role during rites of passage and ceremonies including weddings, funerals and baptisms.

## Key Vocabulary

**Holy**—for someone to be holy, they should be devoted entirely to God.

**Translation**—changing words or text from one language into another.

**Worship**- is an act of religious devotion

**Guidance**—advice aimed at resolving a problem or difficulty with respect to the religion
