1. What do we know about Islam and Allah?

Allah is the Islamic name for God and is the Creator who provides all things.

2. Why is prayer important to Muslims? How often do they pray? (Salah)

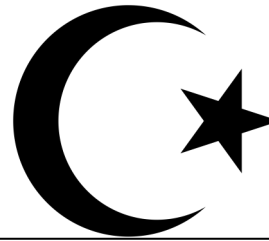
Muslims perform set prayers five times a day at specific times. This is a constant reminder of the importance of Allah in the life of a Muslim.

3 and 4. What is a prophet? Who is Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and why is he important to Muslims?

A Prophet is a person who teaches about the will of God. Muslims believe that Prophet Muhammed is the last prophet. He was chosen by Allah because he was wise, kind and a good family man. Muslims believe that Prophet Muhammad is so special that they say 'Peace be upon him' after his name is spoken. When they write his name they put the letters 'PBUH' after his name.

4. What does the story of 'The Crying Camel' teach Muslims about how to live their lives?

No matter how small or large animals may be, they are all important to God and need to be cared for.



5. What is the importance of Id-ul-Fitr and Id-ul-Adha? (celebrates Hajj-pilgrimage)

Once Ramadan and fasting is over, Muslims celebrate by holding a three day holiday. Id-ul-Adha celebrates Hajj (pilgrimage) which is one of the 5 pillars of Islam.

Key vocabulary

Prophet- person who teaches about the will of God.

Prophet Muhammed- The last Prophet

Salah - performing set prayers five times a day at specific times. This is a constant reminder of the importance of Allah in the life of a Muslim.

Ramadan- remembers the time when Muslims believe the Holy Qur'an was first sent down from Heaven, by Allah, to the Prophet Muhammad.
