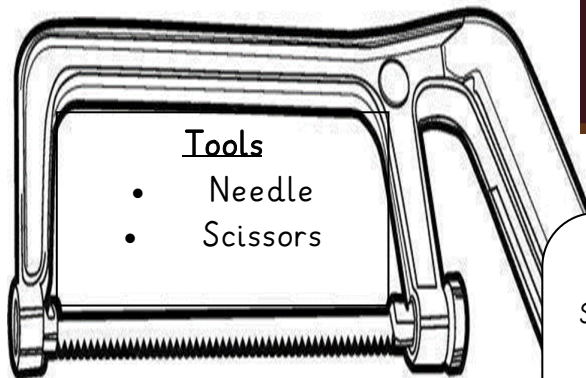
Key Vocabulary

Running stitch—The basic stitch used in sewing. The stitch is worked by passing the needle in and out of the fabric at a regular distance

Joining—link/combining things together

Needle—a tool we use to join fabric together

Thread—we thread the ‘yarn’ through the needle

Applying Past Knowledge

This links to your Year 1 learning where you joined paper using split pins.

How do we join fabric? How can I make a hand puppet?

1. How can I join my material together?

There are many different ways to join fabric pieces together but which is the best? We are going to investigate different ways to join material e.g. glue, sellotape, blu-tac, and needle and thread. Then we will decide which was the most effective.



2. How do I use a running stitch to join materials?

There are lots of different stitches for joining materials. We are going to learn the running stitch.



3. What is the purpose of a puppet?

A puppet is a movable model of a person or animal that is typically moved either by strings controlled from above or by a hand inside it. Puppets can be used as a toy or to perform puppet shows.

4. What do I want my design to look like?

We will design our puppet thinking about who it's purpose and user.

5. Can I use a running stitch to join my material together? How successful was my running stitch at joining the material together?

We will create our design using a running stitch to join the felt before evaluating our completed product.
