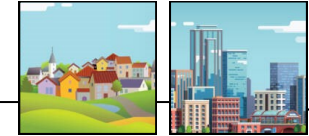
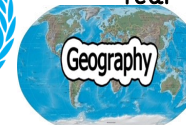


What is it like living in England?



2. What is the difference between a town, a city and a country?

- Country:** an area of land with boundaries which fits within a continent. It is a body of land with its own government.
- City:** huge "urban" place, with lots of tall buildings very close together and millions of people live there.
- Towns:** smaller than cities with a less people but bigger than a village.
