The 're' grapheme is less common but it appears when 'es' is added to some moods ending with the letter ' $\sigma$ ' to form the plural words such as 'tomotoes'. ' potatoes': 'mangoes', 'echoes' 'dominoes'. 'tornadoes' and 'heroes'.
