


# Nursery Newsletter

#### Topic News

##### **'Amazing Animals!'**

This term we have a 'Traditional Tales' focus embedded into our animal theme. We will be reading tales such as The Three Little Pigs, The Gingerbread Man and The Ugly Duckling. Please share some of these stories at home with your child. If you find different versions you can talk about the similarities and differences between them. For our 'topic finale' during the last week of term, we will be inviting parents to stay on and read their favourite traditional tales with the children.

#### YEL's

As part of the children's continuing literacy development we have this year introduced the 'YEL's! These are the Yearly Expected Learning skills that are a systematic progression of non-negotiable skills that we have for the children. They build upon each other term by term and provide an excellent way of focussing the children on what they are already doing well and what their next steps should be to ensure they make as much progress as possible in their writing. Key workers will talk more about these during parents evening.



##### **30th March:** Easter Bonnet parade 9am and 2.30pm


##### **30th March:** Last day of nursery for Easter

### Clothing reminder

Please could we remind parents that the children should be dressed in clothing suitable for all kinds of physical and messy play! Please no 'special clothes'. We also encourage the children to be as independent as possible when going to the toilet, so **please ensure your child can manage their clothes themselves.**

To ensure that all children stay safe in school we do ask that all shoulder length hair is tied up (this applies to both boys and girls) and that no jewellery is worn. We encourage lots of physical activity and the clothing and footwear needs to allow the children to run and climb safely. To help with this please ensure your children are wearing sensible shoes for school.



### PE Sessions



PE lessons will resume on a Monday 27th February. All children will be asked to remove their shoes and socks for this session. A reminder that suitable clothing is needed and we recommend a tracksuit or leggings and T-Shirt on this day. Please could we request that no tights or earrings to be worn on this day.
