# <u>Welcome</u>

We hope that both you and your child are settling into full time school life and that your child is enjoying the experience. This term we will continue to focus on getting to know the children, their ability and their interests. The children will help us to chose a topic over the next week and we will upload the planning overview to the website as soon as this is completed. Look out for the text that will let you know when its available.

This term is all about developing solid foundations to reading, writing and maths skills. We will be focusing on phonics and number awareness.

The children will be bringing home a Sound book every day, in which they will be expected to consolidate the phonic learning from that day and practice that days phoneme. We will also be sending home a maths challenge every fortnight which the children can participate in if they wish too.

After half term the children will also be involved in a weekly Book Smith Apprentice session. During this session they will begin to develop their reading skills which will include oral blending and segmenting of words, rhyming and understanding the features of books. We will send home a weekly blurb that explains our focus and gives ideas on how you can continue the learning at home. We value your comments and would encourage all parents to let us know how the activities went and how your children approached the learning challenges.

#### **School Library**

Every Friday the children in Reception will have the opportunity to visit the main school library and borrow a book to bring home and share with you. The children have free choice in library and although we try to encourage them to choose picture books or those with smaller amounts of text, they often love to pick chapter books or Non fiction books which will require you to share them. It is a fantastic opportunity to encourage that love for reading and enjoyment in discovering different genres of books. Please ensure all Library books are returned the following Friday as the children will not be allowed a new book until the previous book has been returned. Many thanks.

#### <u>Uniform</u>

Please ensure that your child arrives at school in full school uniform everyday. We would also ask that you name all items of clothing, including coats, bags, lunch boxes and shoes. The children will place all belongings onto their peg within the EYFS area so please ask a member of the team if you are missing any items.

## Home Communication Books

Last week your child brought home a blue communication book. This book will be used for communications between home and school and will stay with your child for their entire Hillcross Journey until they leave in Year Six. Please use this book to ask any questions or pass on messages about changes such as who will collect your child. Please note that we do not look in these books daily so if you have written a note it is best to give the book to your child to hand to us first thing in the morning. This way we will know to read the communication and will be able to respond and/or take action. These books will also contain the home learning challenges and our Book Smith Apprentice blurbs. The children in Reception will NOT have a separate reading journal but we do encourage you to develop good reading habits straight away.
