# Reception to Year One Transition information Meeting <u>Thursday 6th July</u>

#### <u>6pm-7pm.</u>

As the children come to end of their time in EYFS and begin to think about their move into Year One we would like to offer parents the opportunity to attend an information evening to discuss how we will be organising the transition for the children. This meeting will give you the opportunity to meet the new teachers and see the Year One classrooms. We will share information about the different expectations in terms of the new curriculum, the organisation of learning and how we develop the learning expectations across the year.

#### **New Classes**

As you are all aware, the children will be placed into new class groups for their transition into Year One. This process will begin over the coming weeks where staff will be observing who the children play well with and asking the children who they learn best with and who they are friends with. The staff will then organise the three new classes ready for Year One. As I am sure you can appreciate this is a process that requires a lot of consideration and one that the staff commits a lot of time and thought over. We want all the children to be happy in their new classes and to ensure we have selected the most suitable group for them to learn effectively in. The new classes will be announced to parents at the Year One transition meeting and the children will be informed the following day. From Monday 10th July the children will be in their new class group in Reception. This may mean coming in through a new classroom door, sitting on a new base room carpet for learning times and being dismissed at the end of the day from a different classroom door. This allows the children to settle with their new peers whilst in familiar surroundings, with familiar adults. **If you have any questions please come and speak to a member of staff.** 

### Home Learning

This term we will be launching a new Home Learning policy across the school. This means that Home learning within Reception will change. You will no longer receive weekly reading blurbs and home challenges to complete weekly and will instead be able to view our Home Learning Palette.

You will be able to access a wider range of learning opportunities at home that you can complete with your child. Please continue to use the blue communication books to write in your comments regarding your child's reading and learning.
