When teaching maths in Early Years we incorporate the characteristics of effective learning.



Playing and exploring, Active learning and Creative and Critical thinking...

Our children are encouraged to develop a natural curiosity for numbers, shape and problem solving.

We do this by providing the children with stimulating activities across the unit. We allow them to explore, repeat, and invent their own ways of using maths resources.


We scaffold their learning by providing the children with key vocabulary, higher order questioning, modelling, challenge and explanation.

We provide a range of contexts for the children to consolidate their learning. This helps the children to make links and become critical thinkers.





Maths Number Progression in Nursery.



Draw attention to a number of objects during play.

Continuous provision includes opportunities to discover and talk about numbers.







Through play children recognise numbers of significance to them. "I'm four! I'll be 5 next."

> Meaningful context- children begin to write numerals on birthday cards.



Developing Number Skills!







Learning to match an amount to the numeral.

Learning to use 1:1 correspondence by setting the table, one object for each person. This progresses to 'touch and count' the object.
