The Hillcross 100 Club is a fun way to raise additional funds for the school whilst also giving those who take part in the lottery style experience the chance to win some cash prizes. The 100 club has sold 18 numbers to date but it has already raised £920 of which £584 has gone into the Hillcross Children's Fund and £336 has been paid out in prizes. The more people who join, the more money we raise for the school and you could be in for an even bigger pay out if you are the monthly winner.

How does the 100 Club work?

The 100 club is a monthly draw which takes place in school, aiming to raise extra funds for resources for the children. Please note there is no draw in August when the school is closed. Parents, staff or governors can pay £5 per month and are allocated a number (you can have more than one number if you wish to). Each month there are three prizes and the more members we have the more money you could win.

How will it benefit the school?

The prize money will be 40% of the membership fee taken that month. The remaining 60% goes to the school via The Hillcross Children's Fund to help purchase equipment, resources and opportunities for pupils.

Therefore, if 100 tickets are sold, the 1st prize will be £100, the 2nd prize will be £60 and the 3rd Prize will be £40. The remaining money will be spent on your children so even if you don't win, your children will still benefit!

Author Fever Continues at Hillcross

Self-development coach, manifesting expert & Sunday Times bestselling author Roxie Nafousi visited Hillcross Primary School in Morden on Wednesday 27th Sept, to talk about her first book for children MANIFEST For Kids! Previously Roxie's fans have included A-listers such as the likes of Bella Hadid, but earlier this term she visited Year 4, 5 & 6 children tat our school o talk about manifesting and how to be their best and happiest selves. The children learnt all about positive affirmations, gratitude, understanding emotions and also tried breathing exercises, before getting their books signed by Roxie.

In MANIFEST For Kids! Roxie explains how the power of the mind can be used to make positive changes in children's daily lives. Designed as an interactive and engaging handbook, the book provides tools to help young people feel happier, more confident and better prepared to cope with day-to-day challenges using the core principles of manifesting. With recent research from Action for Children finding 41% of children struggle with their mental health, this support is needed now more than ever. In the book, Roxie has tailored



her manifesting experience and knowledge into an engaging four-step guide for children, focusing on understanding feelings, growing confidence, gratitude and goal setting.

A year 5 child said 'As well as learning lots of new ideas, Roxie's suggestions link to the strategies everyone is taught during our emotional intelligence sessions. I am a member of the Wellbeing Committee at Hillcross and we can make sure we share the things we have learnt from Roxie with the rest of the school.'



By following this pledge, you will read over 140,000 words every year! This will not only help you improve as a reader but as a learner. Don't forget our Reading Pledge over half term and encourage your child to read for at least 10 minutes every day.

This can be recorded in the yellow reading logs so your teacher can be see what you have been reading.



Our film nights are a fun experience for the children and are a good way of raising additional funds we can use to purchase resources for the children. Following feedback from families with more than one child in school, the **Autumn Term Film Night for all year groups is scheduled for Wednesday 22nd November.** The children in each phase will all attend on the same day and be collected at the same time (even if they watch different films) thus giving families who buy tickets an extended day for Christmas shopping, Spring cleaning or putting their feet up! Black History Month 2023 is a momentous occasion to recognise and celebrate the invaluable contributions of black people to British society

Black people have always been at the forefront of social justice movements, fighting against oppression and paving the way for change. However, despite

their countless contributions to society, the achievements of black women, in particular, have too often been overlooked or forgotten. That is why, this year, the nation will be celebrating the exceptional achievements of black women. This years theme of **'Saluting our Sisters'** highlights the crucial role that black women have played in shaping history, inspiring change, and building communities. This year's celebration will showcase pioneering black women who have made remarkable contributions to literature, music, fashion, sport, business, politics, academia, social and health care, and more.

Allies are people who actively choose to align themselves with those who are marginalized or disadvantaged with the aim of improving their circumstances in the world. We have spoken to the children about how they can become an ally to stand up against racism. This includes:

- Take on issues of racial injustice as your own.
- Speak up if you witness racism.
- Listen and learn from black people and people of colour, without asking them to educate you.
- Keep learning about race and racism.
- Identify and call out stereotypes.



In our school, we promote the acceptance, understanding and celebration of the differences between us all. This year, to embed this further, we are challenging the culture of calling people a 'snitch' if they tell or report to an adult when someone is being hurt or is in danger, or when someone is deliberately being destructive or hurtful. This is different to 'telling tales' on someone when the situation is safe and does not require an adult to be involved.

We are working hard to ensure the children understand that they have a responsibility to report the words and actions of anyone in our school community which causes upset or concern so that we can work together to eliminate discrimination and harassment. Not just in our community but more broadly across society. Some children find this difficult to do when it is one of their friends who has behaved inappropriately. Please remind your child of their responsibility to 'report or tell' an adult if the situation is not safe, regardless of who has made the error of judgement. Only then can we ensure that everyone feels safe and supported, including the person who has made the mistake.



Our Equality Committee have been working with a variety of staff and children across the school in order to find ways in which we can learn more about each other's culture, beliefs and the range of different languages spoken by people in our school community. They are also liaising with the school librarians to ensure that the books we have in school are reflective of everyone in our community.



School Streets Scheme

Please remember the School Streets Scheme is in full operation during term time. This means that you will not be permitted to drive down or park in the roads stated on the notices (including Monkleigh Road and Ashridge Way). If you do so, you run the risk of a PCN fine. The signs set out the restricted hours, with other advisory signs on approach to the road. The operational period for Hillcross, is 8.00am to 9.15am and 2.30pm to 3.30pm.

Break-time Snack

Please remember that the only snacks to be eaten by the Hillcross Primary School are on Twitter children at break time are fruits or vegetables.

All other snacks brought into school will be sent home to be consumed. Dried fruit, such as raisins, apricots or prunes can be sent in, but processed fruit snacks are not allowed as the sugar highs can affect the children's capacity for




GOOD THINGS FOR YOUR CHILD & SCHOOL

All the info you need to know ...

The pupil premium is a Government scheme that provides funding of up to £1,320 per eligible pupil.

The school can use this money to support your child, eg: providing new equipment or possibly additional teaching staff.



THE PUPIL PREMIUM WHAT IT OFFERS...

- Funding to the school to support your child
- A saving of hundreds of pounds to you in the cost of school dinners
- Healthy, nutritious food (which can link to doing well!) provided free of charge

Q: How can I apply?

Simply complete the details on the back of this form and return it to your school. Please provide details of anyone with parental responsibility for your child – whilst you may not qualify, they could.

Q: Why should I apply?

The main reason – you will be helping the school (and therefore your child) as the school will then be able to claim pupil premium funding from the Government. This is worth up to £1,320 per eligible pupil!

It'll only take five minutes to the complete form - why not do it now?

Also, you've probably heard that children in Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) can now receive school meals free of charge. If your child is in Year 3 or above (and you meet the pupil premium criteria), the school will be able to provide them with school meals free of charge. This can help save you hundreds of pounds a year and is a service the school will be happy to provide for you.

Q: My child receives free school meals as they're currently in Key Stage 1. Do I still need to complete this form?

Yes! In order for the school to receive pupil premium funding we need you to complete this form so we can confirm you qualify. Even if your child is already receiving free meals in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2, please complete this form – it'll help both your child and their school.
