



## YEAR 1 CURRICULUM INFORMATION

#### **English**

This half term, we will be writing: a **poem** (In my Toy Box...), retell a narrative (The Enormous Turnip) and an information booklet (based on seasons and weather). We will be focusing on the following skills:

- Forming lower case letters in the correct direction.
- Using finger spaces between words.
- Using capital letters to start sentences.
- Using **full stops** to show the end of a sentence.
- Understanding what a **noun**, **noun phrase** and an expanded noun phrase is.
- Understanding the structure of a sentence.
- Using simple adjectives to describe nouns.
- Spelling words using the phonemes taught.

We will also continue to develop our cursive handwriting.

### Maths

During this half term, we will focus on building on the children's learning from Reception and recap what they have already learnt. We will look at *subitising*, recalling number bonds to 5 and recognising, writing and ordering numbers. We will also focus on:

- Verbally counting forwards and backwards to 20.
- Moving forwards along a number track/line (to add on).
- Partitioning and combining numbers to 10 (number bonds to 10. Knowing that whole numbers can be split into parts. E.g. 10 = 3 + 7, 4 + 2 = 6)

The whole is 3. The parts are 1 and 2.

- Explain that items can be compared using length, height, mass and volume.
- Using equality signs ( <, >, =) to compare a group of objects and / or numbers. E.g. 6 > 2 and 8 < 10.

# Our topic this half term is: A Change over Time

This half-term we will be developing our understanding of how things have changed over time. As **historians**, we will explore the **past** and present and how events in our own lives, and the lives of our family members , will (and have) changed history. As scientists, we will investigate changes in weather and compare and contrast the seasons. In our PSHE lessons, we will develop a better understanding of feelings and how to manage them and stay safe . Also, as artists we will explore Andy Goldsworthy's art.



- Using your green hat create an information poster about a toy from the past. Explain how it worked and what materials it was made from. You could even try to recreate one yourself! This link could help you: https:// www.woodside.bexley.sch.uk/images/Comparing Old and New Toys.pdf\_OR use a tree map to classify toys from the past and present. You could then group them into the different decades. Have the materials changed?
- Investigate Andy Goldsworthy and his art and instillations. Can you use this as a stimulus to create a 'sculpture' in his style. What is the story behind your sculpture? What inspired it? What do the different things represent?
- Read a traditional tale together and use different expressions and voices for different characters. Work collaboratively to ask different family members or friends to take on roles of different characters. To read/ retell your favourite traditional tale. Record this and send it to: info@hillcross.merton.sch.uk
- Linked to our Rights Respecting Schools (RRS), research Article 5. Present your learning to the class in a way of your choosing. Explain what it means for you as children. Why is this article important? You could create a short PowerPoint teaching the rest of the class about this article.
