### Lesson 1: What are the main features of a mosque and what are their functions?

- A prayer room for Muslims to pray
- A mihrab showing the direction of Mecca
- A Minaret to call the faithful to prayer
- A dome to symbolise heaven
- A room to wash before prayers to be clean before God

### Lesson 4: What are the significant features of Muslim birth and marriage customs?

- The adhaan (prayer) is whispered into the baby's right ear (**Birth**)
- A special meal is shared with family and friends (**Birth**)
- After seven days the baby's head is shaved (**Birth**)
- The bride and groom sign the nikah (**Marriage**)
- The Imam reads from the Qur'an (**Marriage**)
- A presentation of a Mahr (a gift, usually money, that the groom gives to the bride) (**Marriage**)

### Lesson 5—What do Muslims see as the purpose of their lives?

Muslims believe that living a meaningful life through worshipping Allah allows them to enter heaven. They believe life is sacred and one of the greatest gifts and blessings of God

Muslims believe earthly life is a test, determining their afterlife, either in Jannah (Paradise) or in Ja-

### Lesson 3: How do the 5 pillars affect daily life?

- There are five key practices that all Muslims are obligated to fulfil throughout their lifetime. These are the pillars which form the foundation of Muslim life.
- They define the identify of Muslims
- Provides a shared set of values and beliefs
- Bind together Muslims from all over the world
- Guide Muslims in their daily life and their worship of God.

The Five pillars guide Muslims in how to show respect and support charity, care, greeting each other, Sa-lah and Wudu.
