### Lesson1: What are the main features of a mosque and what are their functions?

- A prayer room for Muslims to pray
- A mihrab showing the direction of Mecca
- A Minaret to call the faithful to prayer
- A dome to symbolise heaven
- A room to wash before prayers to be clean before God

## Lesson 4: What are the significant features of Muslim birth and marriage customs?

- The adhaan (prayer) is whispered into the baby's right ear (Birth)
- A special meal is shared with family and friends (Birth)
- After seven days the baby's head is shaved (Birth)
- The bride and groom sign the nikah (Marriage)
- The Imam reads from the Qur'an (Marriage) •
- A presentation of a Mahr (a gift, usually money, that the groom gives to the bride) (Marriage)
