



# YEAR 2 CURRICULUM INFORMATION



## **English**

This half term, we will be writing: a **diary entry** (a day in the life of Florence Nightingale), **a biography** (Mary Seacole) and a **narrative** (based on The Hospital Dog).

We will be focusing on the following skills:

- Using capital letters to show the start of a sentence
- Using full stops to show the end of a sentence.
- Using personal pronouns to write in the first person
- Using expanded noun phrases to describe.
- Use adverbs of time to sequence.
- Using the suffix –ed to write in the past tense.
- Use the **conjunctions** and, or, but and because

#### Maths

During Autumn 2, we will continue to develop a secure understanding of number composition and develop strategies for the following:-

- Addition and subtraction of two digit and single digit number
- More and Less with a focus on multiples of ten
- Multiplication to represent equal groups
- Starting to look at times tables with a focus on groups of 2 and commutativity.
- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems

# Our topic this half term is:

# **Hearts and Lanterns**

This half term our Year 2 topic is 'Hearts and Lanterns.' The learning will focus on Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. Within this topic, children will explore how these key women influenced medicine. They will also learn about equalities and gender. In DT, the children will be designing and making their own hand puppets. Children will be focussing on the skill of joining fabrics together by sewing. In science we will look at how humans and other animals survive by researching their basic needs as well as recognising what it means to be healthy.
